

Countering the Fake News of Septic System Maintenance

A YouTuber's ignorant rant could provide a devastating setback to the wastewater industry and the people who rely on septic systems consumers

o you ever wonder how the myth that septic tanks never need pumping gets propagated and remains alive no matter how hard wastewater educators and leaders in our industry try to kill it? Well, you can thank folks like George Tallabas for spreading ignorant misinformation that continues to threaten clean well-water supplies, leads to costly septic system failure for homeowners and ultimately makes your job as pumpers more difficult.

Who is Tallabas, and what is he saying about septic system care? He is a real estate agent in Southwest Idaho who recently shared a brief manifesto on YouTube, advising homeowners that they never need to pump their septic tanks, that pumping septic tanks is — in fact — detrimental to their continued operation.

Yes, we all know the pumping naysayers are out there. Doubtless you've heard many a customer at an emergency call saying someone — Uncle Bob or the neighbor down the street — told them they should never have their septic tank serviced. But these stories usually involve one person talking stupid over the fence to another person. The difference here is that Tallabas decided to share his uneducated views with everyone on the World Wide Web with the video titled Don't Pump Those Septic Tanks.

THE "EXPERT" ADVICE

How did I hear about the real estate agent's rant? A Pumper reader brought the video to my attention and wondered what I thought about it and what we should do as a community to counteract the message.

In his video, Tallabas says that while he was on the local planning and zoning board about 25 years ago, an "expert" from Minnesota addressed the board, sharing what he knew to be true about septic system maintenance.

"He said ... if a septic tank is put in correctly, the drainfield and everything is working correctly, and it's put in the right depth and everything, you should never, ever uncover that septic tank again. When you put in a septic tank and start using it, a certain amount of bacteria develops in there and allows all the solids and liquids to separate, and it works perfectly. ... When you start disrupting that every two to three years (by pumping), you're going to have more problems than you asked for." Doubtless you've heard many a customer at an emergency call saying someone — Uncle Bob or the neighbor down the street told them they should never have their septic tank serviced. ... These stories usually involve one person talking stupid over the fence to another person.

Tallabas goes on to explain he has never pumped his own septic tanks, and his parents before him never pumped theirs. And this goes back to when he was born in 1956.

"When I bought the house where I live now in 2008, and the bank I bought it from asked if I wanted them to pump the septic tank, I said 'no.' I've never had a problem. I have Christmas every year at my house, and I always feed between 15 and 20 people every year and I've never had a problem."

Tallabas did raise a caveat in the video. That was that users shouldn't put bacon grease or other inappropriate things down the drain, or they may be inviting problems. "If we just take care of those tanks the way they were put in, we should never have a problem."

DON'T BLAME ME

He concluded the video saying, "So I'm not telling you not to pump your septic tank and then have a problem, and then come after me. I'm just telling you that I don't believe in it."

In the comment section below the video, a few pumpers tried to argue with Tallabas, but he would have none of it.

"This is bad advice. Don't follow it," wrote one. "Honestly, his argument is similar to saying smoking and drinking are no problem because my 100-year-old aunt drank like a fish and smoked like a chimney and never went to a doctor. ... So you know, stay away from the doctor, too."

Another chimed in, "I'm not a real estate agent, so I don't tell people how to buy and sell houses. With that said, listen to him. ... That way there will be more costly repair work for guys like myself to be able to have. I've been doing this for 35 years. ... Don't complain to me when it backs up and you are hit with a costly repair that could have been avoided."

"I have spoken the truth in this video," was Tallabas' response. And, unfortunately, many viewers responded saying this was correct. Never pump your septic tank.

FOLLOW-UP CALL

I had a few questions for Tallabas. Who was this so-called expert who said septic tanks never needed to be pumped? How can you be so sure of yourself based on your limited experience as a septic system user? Knowing your opinion is refuted by literally every wastewater professional, would you change your mind?

So I reached out to Tallabas. First of all, I must say he was pleasant and congenial when I spoke to him on the phone. But I also must say I was surprised how cocksure he was of his opinions about septic tanks when he clearly has no justification for that confidence.

Who was the expert from Minnesota that helped create the foundation for his expertise in decentralized wastewater? "I've had 3,700 closed transactions and I couldn't even tell you who I talked to yesterday," said the man with 41 years' experience selling houses. The speaker was in the field of planning and zoning and not a wastewater expert, apparently.

Tallabas takes great stock in his own experiences with septic systems. He has never paid to have a septic tank pumped and that's because he knows how to take care of it properly, he explained. Aside from the video, he talks to his neighbors whenever he sees a vacuum truck pull up to their houses. He asks them why they are having the tank pumped, and they say they are following the local health department's recommendation to have periodic service. He shares what the "expert" told him many years ago.

I explained to Tallabas that his opinion runs counter to every university wastewater educator I've talked to, every pumping professional I know and every state and county department of environmental health department in the land. Would that make you think twice about your message in the video or change your point of view on septic system maintenance, I asked?

"I understand it all. Like I said in the video, you don't have to believe what I've told you," he said.

FIGHTING THE "FAKE NEWS"

I told Tallabas that I disagreed with him and that the pumper community would think he was reckless for sharing his opinion when it is clearly wrong, and he can't even name the "expert" source who told him tanks never need to be pumped. I tried to explain how sludge and FOG layer buildup is inevitable, requiring tanks to be pumped. I told him that my state and many others require periodic pumping to protect the septic

systems and precious groundwater from contamination. He said he has been told all of this and it doesn't change his mind.

One argument from the pumper who responded to the video rang true to me. That was saying he wouldn't presume to tell Tallabas how to sell real estate, and Tallabas shouldn't tell pumpers and septic system users how to handle wastewater! This is a reasonable approach, but one that clearly Tallabas doesn't understand.

If he wanted to study the issue, Tallabas would find overwhelming

evidence that his statements are false and harmful both to the environment and to septic system users. But he would rather sputter out incoherently about something he knows nothing about. Unfortunately, the world is populated by many people with that lack of judgment. All we can do in response is speak up to inform and educate the public about the need for septic system maintenance.

Keep fighting the good fight for the benefit of septic system users and the industry that cares about its customers and the environment. \mathbf{P}



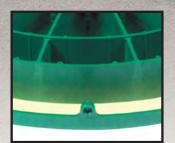



After years working in and out of the pumping industry, an Oregon family has settled into a full-service wastewater business for good

hen Mike Gates sees something going on in a market that could signal problematic changes for his industry, he doesn't just wait around for the fallout to occur. At least twice in his life, he ended up making major life changes.

In the mid-1980s when he was in his 20s, he and his father James were involved in companies that made high-temperature heat shields for the aerospace industry in San Diego. "Then we noticed some changes being made to aerospace," Gates says. "People making important parts for aircraft had to have a clean room. And they wanted me to pick up a liability policy."

In response, he and his father started looking for a business to buy. "We looked at everything from gas stations to picture framing," he says. "We saw maybe 50 or 60 businesses during a five-month period."

They finally found what looked like a good fit in a septic service and portable sanitation company, near San Diego. They met the owners, a young couple wanting to get out. Their accountant looked over the numbers and advised them to buy it. James continued in aerospace and let Mike run the new company.

"The first couple years were really tough," Gates says. "But my dad put all the faith and trust in me. He pretty much cut me loose and told me, 'Here it is, go do it. Put your blinders on and move forward.' That's the only way I succeeded — is because of him and the trust he put in me."

SEEING THE FUTURE

Over the next 15 years, Gates grew the company from 329 restrooms to 2,500. Then, once again, he saw changes taking place that would affect their business. "The building industry was just booming but I noticed they were putting a moratorium on water meters," he says. "They were building homes so quick and they undersized the waterlines, so they had to take a step back. I knew that was going to hurt us."

Gates decided it was a good time to get out. He was also ready to step away from the hectic life the business had demanded. They sold the company, and he moved his family to Eugene, Oregon.

After a brief stint selling heavy equipment, Gates decided to get back into portable sanitation, this time from scratch. He had dreams of his own son joining him and eventually taking over, but those dreams were dashed in 2007 when Travis Gates announced he was going into the seminary. "It hit me hard," Gates admits.

But three years later, Travis called saying he was ready to come home. Gates flew to Minnesota to bring Travis home, and they brainstormed about the business all the way back to Oregon — and they haven't stopped since.

The family operates the company, Above All Sanitation, out of their 106acre property. A barn with eight bays and rollup doors houses the trucks, equipment is kept in the yard and a trailer serves as the office.

Now, as Gates nears retirement, Travis says he pretty much runs the whole thing. The staff of 15 includes his sister Jessica Gates, secretary; aunt Kari Reynolds, office manager; cousin Justin Sims, route driver; and brotherin-law Tyler Gordon, sales and marketing. They cover a 60-mile radius from the Pacific Coast to the Cascade Mountains.



TRAVIS GATES

VARIED RESTROOM SERVICE

Mike Gates received help from former industry contacts when he started his business in Eugene. "From there it just started mushrooming," Gates says. "I got involved with the home builders association. I met a lot of park and rec people."

Today's inventory stands at 1,500 standard portable restrooms, 40 wheelchair-accessible units, 20 ADA-compliant units, 200 hand-wash stations, and 60 250- and 300-gallon holding tanks (all from Satellite and PolyJohn). The company now stocks all units with hand sanitizers.

"We used to just offer it but people didn't want to pay for it," Travis Gates says. "But about five years ago we just decided across the board it's better to have it. And now with the virus, people are insistent on it." The company also has about 60 company-designed metal double-sided hand sanitizer stands built by Eugene Ornamental Iron. They look sharp, Travis says, and the large heavy metal base provides stability and a deterrent to theft.

The bulk of their work is for construction. Most special events were canceled in 2020, but the company typically provides units for the Light of Liberty Fourth of July celebration, the Oregon Country Fair, sand dune tours at the coast, homeless facilities, gospel camps, parks, sawmills, regional vineyards and wedding venues. They are also listed with several Oregon Department of Forestry districts to provide units for fire camps.



Hauling equipment is done with a 16-foot flatbed Isuzu truck from FMI Truck Sales & Service and two 20-unit Explorer trailers from McKee Technologies. The service fleet includes six 2016-2019 Isuzu WorkMate vacuum trucks from FMI, one with an aluminum tank and National Vacuum Equipment Challenger pump, the others with steel tanks and Masport pumps. Each can handle 500-750 gallons of waste/300 gallons of freshwater and carry four units. The newest addition is a 2019 Dodge 5500 built out by PortaLogix with an 800-gallon aluminum waste tank and Masport pump. The 350-gallon water tank is built into the bed of the truck and the vehicle can carry six units. The company uses deodorizer supplies from Safe-T-Fresh (Satellite). Waste goes to the municipal treatment plant or a lagoon treatment facility.

PUMPING AND INSTALLING

Septic service accounts for about 20% of the company's revenue. Pumping is done with a 2017 Freightliner M2 built out by Interstate Truck Bodies, with a 2,200-gallon waste steel tank and NVE Challenger pump. The truck also carries 300 gallons of freshwater for recharging vault toilets pumped out for the federal Bureau of Land Management and Army Corps of Engineers. Plans are to purchase a 5,000-gallon tank truck to go after larger commercial accounts.

Their real estate inspection work has been increasing, and they've also had a lot of repair work in recent months.

"I don't know if it's a generation thing of when certain systems were installed, but we have a lot of repairs going on right now for tanks that have outlet or inlet issues due to tanks that had the cast iron baffles," Travis says. "They're restricting down and causing issues because of the types of pipes they had 20 years ago." He says their Spartan locator has been especially helpful. They also have a Honda 4,000 psi handheld jetter and a RIDGID 200-foot camera.

A slowseason solution

While Oregon winters are not overly severe, work does slow down for Above All Sanitation. To sustain revenue and avoid layoffs, in 2010 Mike Gates came up with the idea of selling janitorial supplies as another service to offer existing customers.

"We started it to pick up the slack," he explains. "Oregon gets quite a bit of rain during the winter months and construction and special events slow down." They began acting as a distributor for several janitorial supply companies. "We sell all kinds of cleaning products and supplies," he says. "Or if someone wants vacuum cleaners or carpet scrubbers we can get that, but we don't stock those."

For a while the company also provided cleaning services for office trailers, gyms and doctors' offices, but the company is phasing out that service. "It was too much of a hassle for scheduling," Gates says. "We had to be there after hours, so you're asking employees to work late hours. Sometimes it was even from 11 at night until 3 or 4 in the morning. We didn't really want to do that to our employees."

Gates reports his idea was successful. "Without any advertising we just reached out to our customers, and it started taking off," he says. "I think we've probably grown it more than 20% every year." The company installs a variety of septic systems. "We can do just about any of them," Travis says. "Oregon has gone away from sand filters. We can install any of the advanced systems and the conventional, and the different drainfields, including the EZflow byInfiltrator or just standard gravel and pipe." Equipment includes a Bobcat T630 skid-steer, a Chevy 2000 5-yard dump truck and three excavators (Takeuchi TB260, Kubota KX121, and for smaller repairs and tight spots a Kobelco SK17). ENCOURAGE FEEDBACK

The company has never done much advertising, Travis Gates says, but in early 2020 he hired Tyler Gordon to do sales and marketing, update the website and bring them onto social media platforms. Gordon also used his film background to film and post customer testimonial videos.

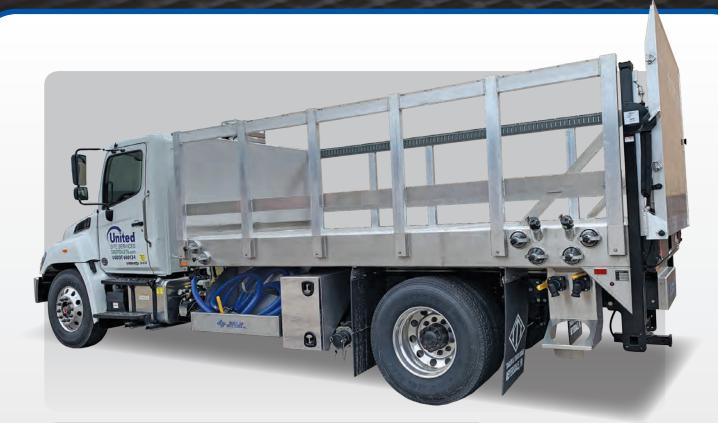
When it comes to hiring, Travis knows not everyone is cut out for this work. He's brutally honest with prospective employees and wants the same from them. "I just tell them, 'I want you to be straightforward with me. Let's do a ride-along and at the end think about it and just tell me straight. And even after a week, if you're like, no, I don't think I can do it, just tell me. I don't want you to be unhappy or me to be unhappy.' Honesty is one of my main things."

The family recently conducted an anonymous employee survey to see if there are any issues not being addressed and to promote good employee relations. Creating a good work environment is very important to Travis. "Everybody's different but it's balancing work where you're not overworking somebody and giving them what they need so they enjoy coming to work," he says.

With few exceptions — and, of course, fire emergencies — the company is closed Sundays. They do publish an emergency number, but only Travis takes the calls. "I won't call someone in for a Sunday," he says. "It's just our company policy."

The company holds monthly breakfast or dinner meetings to go over issues, plans, concerns, new protocols and reminders of seasonal challenges to watch out for (summer bees, winter mold). Bonuses are given in the summer and at the end of the year. The Christmas party, held at a hotel, includes a nice dinner, white elephant games, gift card packages and an overnight stay with breakfast the next morning.

THIRD GENERATION

The Gates family also holds their own monthly meetings to discuss staffing and big-picture matters. One such issue is Mike Gates's impending retirement. "We have a two-year plan where Travis will take it over — maybe sooner," Gates says. Travis is ready for the challenge and looks forward to continuing on the growth path started by his father and doing it in a thoughtful, controlled manner.

Travis has no regrets about the career change he made 10 years ago and is grateful for the opportunity he's had. "I and all the employees are appreciative of what my parents and my aunt Kari have done to bring the company to where it is," he says. "I like helping people out and providing a service they need and seeing people be appreciative."

Travis still runs issues past his dad but appreciates that his father extended to him the same free rein he was given by his father. "I feel confident we're going in a good direction," he says. "I think we have a really bright future."



PUMPER INTERVIEW



Landscaping Tips for Over and Around the Septic System

Your customers might not want to plant plain and simple grass over the drainfield. Be ready to offer interesting, safe alternatives for groundcover to help protect their systems.

hen Scott Chase was approached by a master gardeners group to present a program on landscaping over septic system drainfields, his first thought was, "Sure, I can do that, and the program would just have one slide — grass!" Upon some reflection, however, Chase realized there are lots of other options, and he later prepared and presented a program on planting on and around drainfields. The retired Washington State University Extension program director, who lives on Camano Island, Washington, shared some of those landscaping ideas with *Pumper*.

Pumper: How did you develop expertise in planting around septic system drainfields?

Chase: I headed up a program for the Washington State University Extension for Island County called Shore Stewards. It was for people who live on the islands (Camano Island and Whidbey Island in Puget Sound, northwest of Seattle) about what practices they could do to ensure that our groundwater and our marine water is protected. Part of that involves septic. That was one of the first things to teach them about. A lot of the people who joined are not from here. They are from a major city like Seattle, or they might have come from another state and never lived with septic before. It was really important to learn about that sort of thing, moving to a rural environment. On Camano Island, where I live, everybody is on septic. I had been teaching classes and doing presentations on bluff stability. A lot of people live on shoreline properties where there are bluffs, and they have to worry about that sort of thing. I had also assisted in doing Septic 101 classes. As far as drainfields are concerned, there are lots of other things to plant besides grass, and some of them are the same native plants that I had always encouraged for bluffs, except just the ones that are shallow-rooted plants.

Pumper: Why do the plants have to be shallow rooted?

Chase: We're in a temperate climate in western Washington. We don't really have our ground freeze. Our septic pipes can be as close to the surface as 6 inches. Anything you plant with roots over 6 inches long can get into the drain holes of the pipe and clog things up.

Native plants that are adapted to the area, once they are stable, don't need watering. They get what they need from the normal rain that we have. We don't want to add to that. – Scott Chase

Pumper: Why do you emphasize native plants?

Chase: Once native plants are established, you don't have to worry about watering them at all. I want to discourage watering over the drainfield. We caution against any irrigation. If you are watering, it ends up saturating the ground above the pipes. You like to have it relatively dry. What comes out of the drainfield itself has to be able to be picked up by the roots of the plants. The drainfield has to be able to go through evapotranspiration. That's a process by which plants and trees or any kind of foliage or groundcover soaks up the water from the soil and transpires, basically sweats it out into the atmosphere, through their leaves. A large tree like a Douglas fir can transpire up to 100 gallons of water a day, or thousands of gallons over the summer. Short-rooted plants and other groundcovers don't transpire that much, but they are needed to allow the water, the effluent, to be transpired out as much as possible. The way we look at it, the ground around there is a living, breathing thing. If it is heavy with water, it isn't allowed to evaporate. That's what happens if you have a lot of watering. Native plants that are adapted to the area, once they are stable, don't need watering. They get what they need from the normal rain that we have. We don't want to add to that.

Pumper: What can be planted over the drainfield besides grass?

Chase: There are meadow mixes of seeds that include a mix of broadleaf and grass species and flowers. Sometimes they are called ecolawns. The different plants in the mix are mutually compatible, need less water and less fertilizer than conventional lawns. They are mowable, but they require less

mowing than a conventional lawn. Sometimes they include dwarf perennial ryegrass and hard fescue, clover and alyssum, a small flowering plant.

Pumper: Can trees or bushes be planted near a drainfield?

Chase: Dwarf varieties are better. The advice we give is that the height of what the tree will become is equal to the distance from the drainfield. If it's going to be 30 feet tall, then 30 feet from the edge of the drainfield is the rule of thumb. Before you plant something like that you might check to see how deep that tree's root system will grow, which you can usually get from the nursery or find online.

Pumper: Are there certain things that should never be near a drainfield? **Chase:** Willows are ones that you really want to avoid. Any trees that are really attracted to water, like cottonwoods, you really want to avoid planting near a drainfield. Larger grasses, such as pampas grass and bamboo are also bad.

Pumper: What about landscaping right over the tank?

Chase: There are many options for covering up things that are not as attractive as they could be, like inspection covers. If you do a Google image

search 'hiding septic tank covers,' you'll find hundreds of images, ranging from fake rocks to planters that appear to be large, but are mostly hollow below the top portion. All examples are lightweight and easy to move for inspections and pumping. You'll see circular mosaic pieces that you can place directly over the green riser cover and birdbaths that have a hollow base that can fit directly over PVC septic vents. It's amazing how many decorative solutions are out there.

Pumper: Any advice for installers and pumpers for talking about landscaping with their clients?

Chase: It would be a good idea to have a handout they could give to people relevant to their location in the U.S. They could get information from a local nursery if it's a nursery that specializes in native plants. They might also check with their university extension office or soil conservation district, or the master gardeners program. Most of those would have information relevant to that area. What works for New York doesn't work for Utah, Florida or California. If the pumper or installer gives them something for maintenance and upkeep, they'll remember that. It would be a good way to keep the business name in front of the homeowner.

List of plants for planting on or near a septic tank drainfield



Scott Chase, a retired program director for Washington State University Extension, offers this list of plants that are suitable for planting over a drainfield. Note that this list is specific to western Washington. Some of these plants might be unsuitable for other climates. He recommends checking with local nurseries or university extension offices for suitable plants in other areas.

Deep shade (no direct sun)

• Japanese Spurge (Pachysandra terminalis) is an aggressive evergreen groundcover, which forms a thick cover that minimizes weeds.

- **Carpet bugle** (Ajuga reptans) is an aggressive groundcover that produces blue flowers in spring.
- Irish moss (Sagina) is not a true moss, but a lookalike that is much easier to grow. This does best when mixed with ferns and other plants.
- **Periwinkle** (Vinca minor) is an evergreen groundcover that has periwinkle blue flowers in the spring. In shady areas, it is moderately drought tolerant.
- Wintergreen (Gaultheria procumbens) is an evergreen groundcover that grows ankle high, with spicy scarlet berries all winter long, and pinkish white flowers in summer. You should not mix Japanese spurge, carpet bugle and periwinkle. Select just one.

Partial sun and shade (receiving about four hours of sun)

• **Carpet bugle** (Ajuga reptans) is an aggressive groundcover that produces blue flowers in spring.

• Blue star creeper (Pratia pedunculata) is an attractive, fast-growing evergreen groundcover with a flat carpet of tiny green leaves, smothered with starry bright blue flowers all summer long.

• **Creeping rubus** (Rubus pentalobus) is a species of ornamental bramble, but its small flowers and leaves are much more decorative than its thorny cousins. The rooting carpet of stems can easily grow up to 4 feet in a year.

• Vaccinium "well's delight" (Vaccinium crassifolium) has shiny, dark evergreen leaves with dainty pinkish flowers. A good, 3-inch-tall groundcover for partial sun.

Full sun (receiving about eight hours of sun or more)

- **Kinnikinnick** (Arctostaphylos uvaursi) is a native evergreen groundcover known for its drought tolerance once established. Needs well-drained soil and is not tolerant of wet areas.
- **Blue-Silver Fescue** (Festuca cinema) is an ornamental grass with blue-silver blades. This short, clumping grass requires well-drained soil, and is not drought tolerant.
- **Blue oat grass** (Helictotrichon sempervirens) is an ornamental grass with stiff evergreen blue blades. Requires well-drained soil.
- Fountain Grass (Pennisetum alopercuroides) is an attractive fountain grass with arching stems bearing soft, bottlebrush clusters of fuzzy flowers. This grass grows to about 1 ½ to 2 feet, and is tolerant of moist soils, unlike some other ornamental grasses.
- Vaccinium "well's delight" and creeping rubus are also suitable.

Sun/partial sun near drainfield (not over drainfield)

• Sword fern (Polystichum munitum) is a native evergreen that is easy to grow and is very tolerant of our dry summer months in a full or partly shady location.

• **Deer fern** (Blechnum spicant) is a native evergreen forest fern that grows to a height of 8 to 20 inches, and 24 inches wide. Lance shaped fronds that resemble small ladders. Does best in partial to deep shade and is considered drought tolerant once established.

Various dwarf rhododendrons and azaleas.

Alabama Groups Will Receive Nearly \$5 Million for Onsite Infrastructure Improvements

group of organizations in Alabama will receive \$4.85 million from the U.S. Agriculture Department to develop rural wastewater solutions for the state's Black Belt.

The Consortium for Alabama Rural Water and Wastewater Management will use the money for a technical assistance and training program, and to develop construction-ready plans. The consortium is led by the University of South Alabama and includes the University of Alabama, Auburn University and the Alabama Department of Public Health.

Dark, rich soils are responsible for Black Belt region's name, but those soils also include clay, which retards drainage for onsite systems. The belt covers 17 counties from roughly Tuscaloosa in the west to Bullock and Macon counties near the Georgia border in the southeast.

This grant builds on a \$710,000 grant from Columbia World Projects (part of Columbia University in New York City) in 2020. Columbia said it would match other funds, such as the USDA grant, to a maximum of \$5 million. All the work is intended for the installation and testing of cluster and decentralized wastewater treatment systems at pilot sites.

Information from the tests will be published openly, so anyone can learn from it, said an article from the University of South Alabama.

Kevin White, a professor and chair of the university's Department of Civil, Coastal and Environmental Engineering, said the lack of good rural wastewater infrastructure has many ramifications.

"It's also about the lack of a critical developed world infrastructure that allows for economic growth and development, environmental protection, and public health protection," he said.

Arkansas

Landowners in the Illinois River watershed are eligible to apply for financial assistance to repair or replace failing septic systems. There is no income cap for receiving assistance, but people with lower incomes will get a larger share of the grant. The Illinois River Watershed Partnership is managing the program. A similar program for landowners in the Beaver Reservoir watershed is being managed by Ozarks Water Watch.

Montana

After more than two years of discussions, the Ravalli County Health Board has unanimously passed new wastewater regulations.

The board worked on revisions after dealing with problems such as people who began construction without a permit and people who did not comply with their permits, the *Ravalli Republic* reported. County Commissioner Greg Chilcott said the new regulations are clearer and have reduced penalties and fees.

Commissioner Jeff Burrows, who also chairs the health board, said much information will be going out to the public. Given the influx of new residents, that's especially important, he told the newspaper, because many people moving into the area have never lived in a place without municipal sewer service.

Colorado

Onsite system records for Larimer County are now available online as an attachment on property records of the assessor's office. The information is under the Building Information tab at the top of each records page. In the past, people trying to locate records about their onsite systems had to directly contact the county's Department of Health & Environment. The county has records on about 15,000 permits dating back to the late 1950s.

Texas

Landowners in the Lampasas River watershed may be eligible for money to help repair or replace failing septic systems. The watershed covers part of Mills, Hamilton, Lampasas, Coryell, Burnet, Bell and Williamson counties. Federal grant money available through the Lampasas River Watershed Partnership, in collaboration with Texas A&M AgriLife Extension, is enough to pay for about 15 systems. Residents may receive up to 100% of the cost, up to a maximum of \$8,000.

Massachusetts

The Association to Preserve Cape Cod wants Barnstable County to drop the interest rate charged under the Community Septic Management

Program. Decreasing the rate from the current 5% to zero will enable the county to offer no-cost financing to the thousands of people who are either upgrading onsite systems or connecting to municipal sewers, said a letter from Andrew Gottlieb, the association's executive director, to Barnstable County commissioners.

"The cape has failed to invest in the level of advanced wastewater treatment needed to restore and preserve our marine waters," he wrote, according to *The Bourne Enterprise*. Barnstable County covers all of Cape Cod.

Minnesota

A group of Amish men have petitioned the U.S. Supreme Court to review their wastewater regulations case. No appeal is guaranteed because the court may reject a case if justices believe there are no significant legal issues for them to decide.

Since 2006, Fillmore County has contended the Amish must install onsite systems for graywater disposal. (The Amish use outhouses for human waste, which is permitted under Minnesota law.) The Amish refused, saying the county's rules infringe on their religious beliefs. Instead of a septic system, the Amish proposed using a mulch basin system. During a trial in the case in 2019, a witness said a mulch basin would not work in Fillmore County.

The Supreme Court petition repeats the claim that county rules violate the constitutional right of the Amish to practice their religion. The brief from the attorney for the Amish said, in part, that the county and state failed to prove "that their generic interests in public health and environmental protection were so compelling in this specific application as to justify trampling Petitioner's religious beliefs."

In addition, the brief asserts the county and state failed to show that mulch basins were not an acceptable alternative.

At the end of the trial, Judge Joseph Chase wrote that by not following wastewater rules, the Amish interfere with the rights of others.

"This is a situation in which the Amish cannot, despite their most sincere efforts, be separate from the world," he wrote. "All water is connected, and all of us, Amish and English alike, drink from the same aquifers."

Owners of failing septic systems in Polk County may apply for costsharing to repair or replace those systems. Funding for repairs is through a grant from the Minnesota Clean Water Legacy Act. Money is limited, and preference will be given to people based on household income, condition of the existing system and proximity to surface water, KROX News reported. Homes involved must be a primary residence, and landowners will be required to pay any match up front.





Pumping Should Be Required for Thorough System Inspections

When a local municipality moves to eliminate mandatory pumpouts for lake home onsite inspections, the Answer Man steps in with solid advice

bout a year ago I wrote about troubleshooting some problems with system backups and mentioned it was important to periodically inspect and pump out septic tanks to prevent problems in the future. This prompted a comment from a reader, a leader of a lake association, that highlighted the group in a process of inspecting all systems near the lake looking for malfunctioning or failing systems.

The program included a mandatory, concurrent pumpout during the inspection. The reader stated, "We, like you, believe that this is the best approach for detection of improperly functioning septic systems. Our local municipal council, with advice from the chief building inspector, has recommended to drop the mandatory pumpout concurrent with the inspection for the remainder of the program. Strangely, a pumpout is required, but not at the time of the inspection. There has been no adequate rationale provided to date for this recommendation."

This is apparently a one-time, across the board program to identify systems that need fixing or replacement. As I have explained in the past, this is one approach to inspections. Others are compliance inspections (the inspection referred to could be a compliance inspection as well) to make sure all system components are up to date; inspections at time of installation to make sure everything is up to current regulations; and inspections at time of real estate sales. While the purposes of these inspections are somewhat different, the actual inspection activities should not be different.

Any inspection of an operating system should involve opening the tank observing the contents, evaluating structural soundness, watertightness, condition of the inlet and outlet baffles along with the piping in and out of the tank.

STRUCTURAL INTEGRITY

If the tank is operating as it should, there will be three distinct levels observed. There are floatable solids (scum); a relatively clear zone where effluent is drawn through the outlet baffle and sent to the next treatment component; a sludge layer of settleable solids. If there are not three layers, the reason why should be determined and corrected to prevent solids from plugging the outlet or moving out of the tank. An inspection to evaluate how well all the systems around the lake are working requires pumping out the tank. Without removing the tank's contents, structural integrity cannot be assured.

As an aside, many states and municipalities have requirements to evaluate sludge and scum accumulations periodically, and when they reach 25% to 30% of settleable area, pumping the tank is required. My town requires inspection every three years and a mandatory pump every six years regardless of the levels. As for me, I always have them pump the tank regardless; I look at it as my own little insurance policy to prevent problems down the road.

Structural soundness and watertightness can best be determined by pumping the tank. Before pumping, the liquid level should be observed. It should be at the invert of the outlet. If it is below, it means effluent is escaping the tank through cracks or holes. If the liquid level is above the invert, some type of blockage is occurring. The interior of the tank should be inspected for any deterioration, such as pitting or spalling of the concrete and any other cracks or holes. All tanks — no matter the material — should be investigated for the presence of roots, which indicate the presence of cracks or problems with the joints present in the tank.

INSPECTION DETAILS

Baffles and screens in the tank should be evaluated. There should be baffles at both the inlet and the outlet, contrary to other comments I receive from time to time. The inlet baffle directs the flow down into the tank, preventing short-circuiting of effluent directly to the outlet. This provides the settling time for the larger solids. For this reason, sludge depth should be

thickest under the inlet baffle. The bottom of the outlet baffle should be in the clear water zone of the tank.

Baffles should be evaluated for proper position, secured well to the piping or tank wall, clear of solids and not deteriorating. If there is evidence of corrosion, particularly at the outlet, the tank should be tested for proper venting to keep corrosive gases from accumulating. The piping into and out of the tank should be inspected to see that it is not cocked at an angle due to tank or piping settling. If the piping in either location is not correctly seated, blockages can occur, causing backups.

Septic tanks now usually have effluent screens at the outlet. They should be removed, cleaned, evaluated for any cracks or irregularities and replaced if necessary. An important note — the effluent screen should not

be removed for inspection until the tank has been pumped at least below the outlet baffle to prevent solids from moving out of the tank.

Specific to the reader's comments, an inspection to evaluate how well all the systems around the lake are working requires pumping out the tank. Without removing the tank's contents, structural integrity cannot be assured and critical information about whether the system may experience problems in the drainfield or in the future will be lacking.

If baffles are out of place or at risk of deterioration, these problems can be fixed before they cause problems in the drainfield due to plugging and surfacing effluent or backups into the house. This type of community-wide inspection program is an opportunity to set all the systems up in the area for long-term trouble-free operation.









"Big Data" Is Not Just Helpful for Big Companies

Even mom and pop wastewater businesses can benefit from focusing on the trends of a few important metrics to raise the bottom line

Big Data is critical to business success because it provides important insights and information. Large enterprises use sophisticated systems to track data and often have internal analysts on their team to crunch their numbers. Or they hire outside experts to do it for them. Yet any enterprise can take advantage of Big Data, no matter their size, especially if you reframe your definition of "big." You can use your data to better understand customer needs and buying patterns to further develop strategies that could impact sales. Insights like those developed using data become amazingly useful to any company, no matter how small.

Don't Be Afraid of Analytics

You've heard some people say, "I'm really not a numbers person." Perhaps they use this as their excuse for avoiding data, much less Big Data, because they might feel reluctant to dive in and give it a try. You do not need an MBA or finance degree to begin working with the data associated with your business. Anyone can learn and understand at least a couple of the key metrics that impact how businesses operate and what drives financial success.

Use Your Tools

You do not need a complicated computer system or major data management firm to figure out what you are already using in your business for data capture. Frankly, many small businesses are not fully utilizing the existing software they have to gather basic information. > Once the data is put into an analytic format, you can do all sorts of evaluations based on key variables such as customer demographics, profitability, geographic location, purchasing patterns and buying volume.

Frequently, software programs have the capability to export information into analytical programs such as Excel. Once the data is put into an analytic format, you can do all sorts of evaluations based on variables such as customer demographics, profitability, geographic location, purchasing patterns, buying volume, etc. Reviewing data points for various time horizons provides a comparison to see how much is changing during different time periods.

Engaging in analytical assessments of your data often provides valuable information on shifts in your target market and identifies new sales opportunities. You might even uncover areas of business vulnerability before they cause major challenges.

Many companies do not fully access the information they have already obtained about their customers. Taking time to input detailed information into a contact relationship management (CRM) system can be a first step. Consolidate the insight from your other information systems to develop a comprehensive customer profile. Then drill down into the information on your customers and tie them to financial measurements such as sales volume, degree of profitability or key target marketing variables.

It is not uncommon for small businesses to have their most valuable customer information written down on sheets of paper or in someone's head. If you enter your data into a CRM or Excel, you establish the foundation for a more robust data assessment. Then you can begin to pull insights by looking carefully at key variables.


You can certainly do some of this work yourself, but it might be even better for you to loop in key employees who may be better skilled than you at putting it together. Then you can review the information and draw conclusions.

An Aging Workforce Remains Our Biggest Challenge

A Wisconsin wastewater pro echoes a common industry theme: We need enthusiastic young people entering the field

In States Snapshot, we talk to a member of a state, provincial or national trade association in the decentralized wastewater industry. This time we visit a member of the Wisconsin Onsite Water Recycling Association.

Name and title or job description:

Todd Stair, vice president. I wear all hats — master plumber restricted, soil tester, septage operator, customer contact, bidding, some design work, some soil testing, training, safety.

Business name and location: Herr Construction (fourth generation in the industry), Oconomowoc, Wisconsin, in the "Lake Country" area of the southeastern part of the state

Services we offer: Soil testing, septic system installs, sewer and water work, sewer camera, sewer sectional lin-

ing, excavating, drainage, stormwater systems, trucking and excavating.

Years in the industry: 32

Association involvement: I have been on the Wisconsin Onsite Water Recycling Association (WOWRA) board of directors most years since the mid-1990s. I was president from 1997 to 2001 and was again recently voted in as president.

Benefits of belonging to the association: Benefits include having legislative representation, staying at the forefront of laws affecting our industry, education and continuing education hours, the annual conference with lots of great classes, other training throughout the year, and networking to learn from colleagues and regulators.

Biggest issue facing your association right now: The graying of the industry. Membership numbers are low. Where's the next generation?

Our crew includes: We have amazing people, starting with my wife, Peg Stair, and Kelly Reese in the office. Ann Cataldo is lead soil tester and a master plumber. Jeff Reese and Ben Hilmer are crew leads. Mike Esguerra and Chris Brezinski are pumpers, have their plumber learner cards and drive the dump truck. Jason Strankowski, Jeff Christensen, Jeremy Wagie, Nate Strankowski and Dakota Wirth round out the crew.

And Mark Ridgman, our mechanic, keeps everything running. We strive for everyone to have as many licenses as we can help them achieve plumbing, soil testing, pumping, well pump installation, commercial drivers' licenses.

Typical day on the job: Although no day is typical, mine usually includes getting crews prepped in the morning, helping to get the day's initial schedule complete (and it changes frequently), meeting with potential customers, bidding jobs. I perform soil tests when needed, help out on crews when short-handed and, when the schedule dictates, I do some of our sewer camera work.


The job I'll never forget: We installed a replacement private onsite wastewater treatment in-ground system for a national TV show called Extreme Home Makeover. The first thing that stuck out is that the streets were lined with people waiting for the show to start filming — and the first thing that came down the street was our pump truck, as we had to pump and abandon the existing septic system. Crowds on both sides of the street cheered. I've never seen hundreds of people cheer a pump truck

before. Then there were storms and tornado warnings and we had to remain on standby. When we finally got the okay to install the septic system it was 10:30 p.m. We installed the system under artificial lighting and had to wake up the inspector in the middle of the night. He was very understanding about it.

My favorite piece of equipment: While the excavators are extremely important in our industry, I'd have to say my favorite tool is the sewer camera (RIDGID). It's such a versatile tool and we're using it more and more. To be able to both visually see a sewer problem and accurately locate it is something previous generations could not do as efficiently.

Most challenging site I've worked on: We did a job far up on a wooded knob of a site that was a straight drop-off on three sides. We did the septic prior to basement excavation. Every grain of soil had to be hauled offsite. Of course they waited for the middle of winter to begin the project. We had dump trucks driving down very dangerous wooded roads in pure ice conditions.

Oops, I wish I could take this one back: We learned the hard way not to base a bid on information someone else gives us. We're currently working on a project where we trusted the information a municipality provided and are now digging ourselves out of a lose-lose situation. A little tiny honey-do turned into three days of digging up someone's yard. Moral of the story — do your own due diligence or risk losing money.

The craziest question I've been asked by a customer: "How many holes should I shoot through the 55-gallon drum I'm installing as my septic system for my hunting cabin up north?"

If I could change one industry regulation, it would be: I'd like to see more uniformity. It's frustrating when one municipality requires something different than another.

Best piece of small business advice I've heard: Rich Herr, owner of our company at the time he hired me in 1989 said, "Any work you do, do it as you would want it done at your own home. Think every job is your own house, do excellent work and don't skimp on any facet of what you are doing." Everyone at our company lives that advice on every job.

If I wasn't working in the wastewater industry, I would: I love astronomy, science and wastewater treatment so it would probably be something in the field of science.

Crystal ball time – This is my outlook for the wastewater industry: I am hopeful the younger generation steps up with as much passion for what we do as we have. I hope they keep improving POWTS treatment and protection of groundwater in ways we haven't even imagined. And, thirdly, I sincerely hope our industry changes the paradigm of water use and guides our nation to understand the importance of stormwater as a resource for nonpotable purposes, as we work every day with the tools to make that happen. - Compiled by Betty Dageforde

Laws and restrictions often play a factor in choosing the best equipment for your business, like the tanker endorsement required by the U.S. Department of Transportation for any truck with total combined volume exceeding 1,000 gallons.
